

A visionary endeavor, now at risk

The Appalachian Trail is one of America's greatest cultural legacies. It is a project that came into being through Benton MacKaye's visionary leadership in the early 1900's and has since been the collective endeavor of volunteers, public servants, outdoor enthusiasts and community activists - a rich celebration of our nation's natural heritage.

The 282 miles of Appalachian Trail in Maine is particularly special. It runs through the largest undeveloped ecoregion on the East Coast and is widely regarded as the finest section on the 2,189 mile-long Trail.

Much of the land surrounding the A.T. in Maine is unprotected, and now at risk of development, placing the economic, cultural, ecological and intrinsic value the Maine woods have provided for centuries at stake.




The Trail is more than just a path in the woods – it is a rich, interconnected system of land, rivers, lakes, towns, wildlife and people across time.

It is a cherished natural endowment to the citizens of Maine and visitors from around the world.

The East Coast's last great wilderness

- Maine's mountains are home to an incredible selection of flora and fauna, from alpine vegetation to migrating songbirds to large mammals – all dependent on this unique habitat
- Local economies depend on the land for sustainable timber harvesting and recreation, as they have for generations
- Millions take to the mountains throughout the year to enjoy unrivaled hiking, hunting, fishing and camping opportunities
- Natural areas provide invaluable ecosystem services: clean air & water and climate change mitigation
- Maine's shared outdoor heritage has always been a central tenet of the state's identity and quality of life







The Maine Appalachian Trail Land Trust was formed in 2002 as an independent land trust for the purpose of acquiring and protecting the land surrounding the Appalachian Trail in Maine for public benefit.

Our organization is part of a greater coalition of organizations working together to protect the Appalachian Trail Landscape in Maine.

Protecting Maine's wilderness heritage

- More than 30,000 acres conserved for protection of the A.T. landscape
- 10,000 acres slated for conservation in 2018
- 28 miles of the Appalachian Trail corridor protected from incompatible use
- Five of Maine's most prominent mountains protected (Saddleback, Abraham, White Cap, Crocker and South Crocker)
- · Dozens of miles of multi-use trails
- Hundreds participate in on-Trail events annually

- Raise funds & awareness to continue our mission of protecting land along the A.T. in Maine


